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

Vote for me as your academic executive and I will do everything in my power to ensure that ALL your voices, opinions, feedback and ideas are not just heard- but actually acted upon.



About myself I am an enthusiastic and happy individual person, who's willing to get all the students be benefitted with the best Oppurtunities and platform we're they can be exposed globally.




